

Francophone Communities Across Canada

Learning Outcome: Identify and share information about Francophone communities across Canada.

Along with your partner (or individually), research a Canadian Francophone community and present your findings to the class. Make sure to comment on the cultural aspects, practices, and traditions of your Francophone community.

Topics to cover in your presentation should include:

- Celebrations/Festivals
- Food
- Geography/Territory
- History
- Population
- Anything else you want to add

You may present the information using the following choices: a display board, power point, booklet, written report, story, poem(s), advertisement, brochure, collage, comic strip, diorama, mural, photo album, photo essay, poster, model, or a rap.

You must include:

- Information from at least 2 different sources about your community from all the categories listed above.
- A map of Canada with your community's territory highlighted.

Criteria

- All information categories are included *in your own words*.
- A map is included.
- Pictures are included.
- Correct spelling and grammar are used in a neat and legible presentation.
- Bibliography is included that lists your sources.

Oral Presentation

- Speak clearly and loud enough for the class to hear.
- Share all required information.
- Each group member must be included in the presentation. (You may have one member do all the speaking, but both members must be at the front of the room).
